How to prevent wasps
and hornets in the garden

To limit the presence of wasps and hornets and prevent them from building nests in your yard, use a combination of deterrent and preventive measures.



1 Protect at-risk areas

- Treat eaves, soffits and gables with WASP OUT[®] in the spring.
- Seal cracks around soffits, siding and pipe entry points.
- Seal abandoned rodent burrows in the spring.
- Cover sandboxes.
- Store firewood away from the house.
- Regularly inspect garden sheds, outbuildings, play structures, outdoor furniture and umbrellas.
- Grow mint, lemongrass or thyme near dining areas.

2 Sanitize and eliminate attractants

- Avoid taking food and drinks out in advance for outdoor meals and keep them in tightly sealed containers for as long as possible.
- Put away food as soon as you finish eating and clean dining areas promptly.
- Clean up sugary drink stains and spills with vinegar or soapy water.
- Thoroughly clean the BBQ and any cooking splatters on patios.
- Avoid leaving pet food outside.
- Keep your garbage can lids tightly closed.

LOCATE AND ELIMINATE THE NEST WITH WASP OUT®

Wasp and hornet control is essential when they build their nests in areas where the risk of stings is high. Eradicate them promptly, before the nest and colony grow.



How to find a wasp or hornet nest

Do you suspect the presence of a nest on your property due to the impressive number of wasps or hornets around the house?

Here are 4 ways to locate it:

- Observe the areas where you see them in greater numbers.
- Inspect the areas where they usually build their nests.
- Observe the comings and goings of wasps or hornets. In the early morning or late afternoon, they will most often fly to their nest to bring back food.
- Listen carefully. A low buzzing sound can confirm the location of the nest, even if it is not visible.

How to eliminate a nest in 7 easy steps

1. Choose a WASP OUT® insecticide specifically designed for this purpose, available as aerosol or foam.
2. Apply early in the morning or late in the evening, when wasps and hornets are less active.
3. Shake the container well, then wait 30 seconds before using the product.
4. Stay a safe distance from the nest, never under it.
5. Point the nozzle towards the nest opening.
6. Hold the container upright and spray until the nest is saturated.
7. Wait 48 hours before removing a treated nest.

WHY

DO WASP TRAPS POSE A DANGER TO BEES?

The WASP OUT® Wasp Trap contains
no chemicals and is safe for bees.

The bait used will attract wasps but will
be of no interest to bees and most insects.
You can place a trap near hummingbird
feeders if wasps are a problem.



WHY

To get rid of nuisance wasps around your property.

WHERE

In the garden, at the cottage, on a picnic,
when camping or anywhere else.

ACTION

Simply combine a bait (a piece of raw meat, fish
or cat food), sugar and fruit juice to attract wasps
into the trap, where they will drown.

BENEFITS

Chemical-free, simple to use, easy to carry and reusable.

TIP

Place the trap away from outdoor living areas, as it
attracts wasps. Install it at the beginning of spring to
capture the emerging queen before she has time to
build her nest.



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SAFETY AND EFFECTIVENESS TIPS

- To eradicate a nest, proceed early in the morning or ideally late in the evening, when the wasps are less active and have returned to the nest.
- Wear long, thick clothing.
- Always use an insecticide specifically designed for this purpose, such as WASP OUT® products.
- Always follow the instructions on the packaging.
- Do not remove the nest immediately after spraying in case some insects are still alive. Wait 48 hours.



WHEN TO CALL IN A PROFESSIONAL

Sometimes, the presence of a nest is only noticed when the colony has reached a considerable size or after the wasps have found a way into the house.

- If the nest is not visible, or if you hear a buzzing sound inside the walls, call a professional exterminator.
- If you are dealing with an underground nest, whether in a flower bed or a sandbox, cover its entrance with a tarp or pour diatomaceous earth into it, then call a professional.
- You should also hire an exterminator if you are allergic to wasp stings.
